INDTEX17	Monkey cap	Brown woolen cap	Worn by boys and girls in cold areas in the north of India.
INDTEX18	Cap	Embroidered cap	Worn by Muslim boy for special occasion. It is respectful to cover the head. An 'everyday' cap would most likely be white.
INDTEX19	Scarf	Grey with red and black	Rajasthani block print
INDTEX20	Scarf	Beige, brown and green	Kalamkari from Andhra Pradesh
INDTEX21	Scarf	White, blue, black	Batik design
INDTEX22	Scarf	Large, bright blue and yellow with fringe	Silk scarf from Andhra Pradesh. Could be used as a table cloth.
INDTEX23	Bags	3 different woven bags	2: cream with Indian design / words printed. 1: cotton, woven - black, blue, yellow
INDTEX24	Golden shoes (bride)	Adult size shoes for a bride	Brides like to wear brightly coloured and golden clothes
INDTEX25	Items from Gujarat	Two bags and a doll in bright mirror work - embroidered	These fabrics, with bright embroidery and mirror work, are typical of the area. The small purse is for holding a mobile phone and the large one for use as a handbag. The doll is wearing traditional clothes of the area.
INDTEX26	Sarong in a bag	Recycled sari	This sarong is made from fine cotton and is the recycled 2 metres end of a sari. A sari is anything
